Dear Resident

I believe everyone deserves a fair start in life, so I support Labour's costed plans for employment schemes and funded, accessible education for all. It is impossible for families to keep up with rising costs whilst pay rises stagnate; therefore, I will stand with Labour to empower locals by providing discounted office spaces and free legal and tax advice, encouraging entrepreneurs. 

Your local NHS



Unprecedented underfunding has caused dangerously long waiting times for appointments, surgeries and A&E. Labour will integrate social care with the NHS, halt A&E closures and improve mental health services by investing £6billion, raised in part through increasing income tax for the highest 5% of earners.

Good Quality Education



Labour will create a National Education Service (NES) which extends free education to adults and early years children. We will tackle the teacher retention crisis, deliver an inclusive SEND strategy, fund schools-based counselling in all schools and reduce class sizes for 5, 6, and 7-year-olds.

As your MP I will:

- 1 Protect our valued local healthcare services which are under threat, and support Labour's plans to invest in social care and mental health services.
- 2 Improve local school facilities and work with Labour to provide funded education for early years children and adults in formal tuition.
- 3 Prioritise local infrastructure to back development, supported by a National Investment Bank.
- 4 Increase access to affordable home ownership and help to introduce rent controls which end insecurity for private renters.
- 5 Defend the rights of our residents in Brexit negotiations.
